
Medium Monarch Garden



Watering Tips:

Depending on drainage, plants in your yard may need more or less water than we recommend. You do not want to overwater native plants, so experiment with how long your plants can last before beginning to wilt. After a couple years, your established natives may only need occasional summer watering.

Narrowleaf Milkweed (Asclepias fascicularis)

<u>Care</u>: Full sun, water deeply 1-3x a week. This plant goes dormant in winter; stop watering during winter and cut back dead stems. <u>Bloom season</u>: Summer

Black Sage (Salvia mellifera)

<u>Care</u>: Full sun. Water once a week first 5 months. Once established, water once a month or every other week. <u>Bloom season</u>: Summer-Fall

Coyote Mint (Monardella villosa)

<u>Care</u>: Full sun/partial shade. Water once a week first 5 months. Once established, water once a month or every other week. <u>Bloom season</u>: Spring-Fall

Gumweed (*Grindelia camporum*)

<u>Care</u>: Full sun. Water once a week first 5 months. Once established, water once a month or every other week. <u>Bloom season</u>: Spring-Fall
