
Medium Monarch Garden



Depending on drainage, plants in your yard may need more or less water than we recommend. You do not want to overwater native plants, so experiment with how long your plants can last before beginning to wilt. After a couple years, your established natives may only need occasional summer watering.

Watering Tips:

Narrowleaf Milkweed (*Asclepias fascicularis*) <u>Care</u>: Full sun, water deeply 1-3x a week. This plant goes dormant in winter; stop watering

during winter and cut back dead stems. <u>Bloom</u> <u>season</u>: Summer **California Aster** (*Symphyotrichum chilense*) <u>Care:</u> Full sun/partial shade. Water once a week

<u>Care:</u> Full sun/partial shade. Water once a week first 5 months. Once established, water once a month or every other week. <u>Bloom season:</u> Summer Slender Sunflower (Helianthus gracilentus) <u>Care:</u> Full sun. Water once a week first 5 months. Once established, water once a month or every other week. <u>Bloom season:</u> Spring/Summer/Fall

California Goldenrod (Solidago velutina spp. californica)

<u>Care:</u> Full sun/partial shade. Water once a week first 5 months. Once established, water once a month or every other week. <u>Bloom season:</u> Summer/Fall
